
Imathia is one of the oldest inhabited districts in Greece. Its name is mentioned by ancient poet Homer as well as by the famous historian Herodotus.



Our town is named Plat, which means wide. Plat has a population 2,083 inhabitants according to the 2011 census.



The old logo of the municipality of Platy proves how important the Railway Station has been for the local population. We'll see more about that later on!

Religion is a prominent aspect of people's life in Greece. Citizens of Platy worship two saints who were both born in Varasos, the motherland of the refugees: Saint Arsenios of Kappadokia and Saint Paisios.
